COLOURS OF THE CHARS, CRAFTSMANSHIP OF BANGLADESH

Following its place of honour at the Musée de la Marine in Paris, the 'Ancient sails of Bangladesh' exhibition in 2010 at Neumünster Abbey revealed a wide public interest in the cultural heritage and the splendour of the boats meticulously recreated by Friendship's teams.

Now you can rediscover the models and the artists at La Belle Etoile shopping centre from 9th to 17th May.

Also on sale are the scarves and bags from the 'Colours of the Chars' collection. These are produced in the Friendship weaving and sewing centres in the Brahmaputra islands, which provide training and a source of income to hundreds of women.

Friendship has been operating in Bangladesh since 2002, bringing an ever wider range of services to the poorest communities in the most remote areas of the country – the alluvial islands of Brahmaputra in the North and the Bay of Bengal in the South.

In 2002 Friendship began its activities in the field of **HEALTH** by setting up the country's first hospital ship.

Today the organisation has three hospital ships and a primary healthcare network that provides health services to more than 150,000 people per month.

In 2004 Friendship embarked on an **EDUCATION** programme which now comprises 74 primary schools and adult literacy centres.

In order to promote economic independence, an innovative saving and MICRO-FINANCE scheme has been established in a growing number of communities. Operating in an environment which is particularly exposed to climatic fluctuations, emergency aid and even more importantly NATURAL DISASTER PREPARATION are essential to the work of Friendship.

As well as this, Friendship's **CULTURAL PROJECT** to preserve the traditional river way of life has drawn attention to the disappearance of Bangladesh's wooden boat-building industry and raised awareness of the need to preserve this heritage.

In November 2007, Hurricane Sidr struck The Bay of Bengal, killing almost 10,000 inhabitants. Devastating as the death toll was, this was only the second most powerful cyclone to hit the Bay since 1877. In 1970 a less powerful cyclone caused 300,000 deaths.

The relatively less devastating death toll in 2007 was largely due to the construction of several cyclone shelters to protect the population after the 1991 disaster. However, these shelters are still insufficient in number and remain far from meeting the needs of the inhabitants.

Friendship is working to improve disaster preparation for coastal communities particularly exposed to natural disasters, by setting up what is intended to be an exemplary cyclone shelter. Crucially, it will include livestock accommodation, without which the population is reluctant to use a shelter for fear of losing what can amount to a family's livelihood. The shelter will be used on an everyday basis as a school and community centre.
